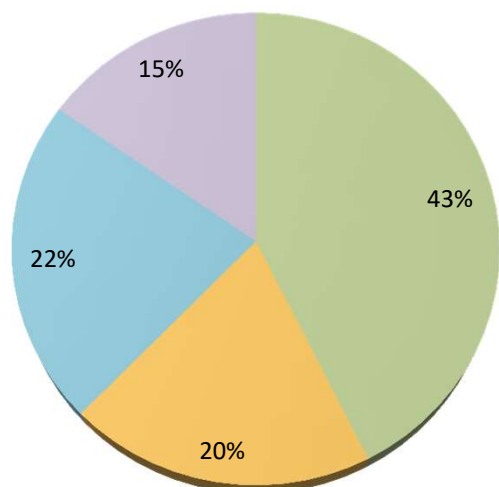


NYC Parents Want “No Harm” Grading for Remote Learning

No Harm - Keep numeric grades for the remote learning period; the Final Grade should DROP the lowest grade of all the marking periods. "No Harm"

Grade Freeze - Use Pass/Fail grade for the remote learning period; the Final Grade includes only the numeric grades BEFORE the remote learning period. "Grade Freeze"

NC
20%

No Change - Keep numeric grades for the remote learning period; the Final Grade includes grades from ALL the marking periods. "No Change"

School Decides - I want my principal to set the grading policy for my child's school, for the remote learning period and for the final grade. "School Decides"

Parents with kids **applying to middle and high schools** were even more in favor of No Harm, followed by No Change.

The parents surveyed represent more than 600 students attending grades K-12 in 17 districts across our five boroughs.

About the Survey: PLACE NYC Parent Survey on “NYC Grading Policy for Remote Learning” was conducted on 4/19/20-4/20/20. The survey link was posted on FACE NYC Facebook and WeChat groups w/over 700 members; parents also shared the survey with their school groups. The Surveys are ad-hoc checks on parent opinions on topics of interest and importance to parents and guardians of NYC public school students.
